1. ' Only one project proposal per community will be accepted per fiscal year.
2. ' No proposals for in-school program support will be considered.
3. ' Proposals should be project based: have a beginning and end within the year 2006-2007.
4. ' Projects should be community driven.
5. ' Projects proposals should identify resources from other funders.
6. ' No multi year proposals or multi language proposals will be accepted. Heritage Canada does not guarantee funding.
7. ' Start Date for all projects should be: **April 1, 2006**.
One half will be released on signing.
8. ' An Interim Narrative and Financial Report is required by **December 16, 2006**.
One half of balance will be released upon receipt of this Report.
9. ' Projects must be completed by **March 31, 2007**.
10. ' Did you remember to include 2 letters of support?
11. ' Did you include a detailed Budget?
12. ' Did you include a covering letter on your organization or sponsor's letterhead?
13. ' Did you number all pages?
14. ' Did you submit 5 copies of your proposal?
15. ' Did you include the Application Form?

Eligible Project Costs:

Sample Ideas/Samples of Possible ALI Proposals:

ALI Language projects should demonstrate strategies that promote the intergenerational transmission (to include grandmothers, mother, child) of First Nations languages and the mobilization of speakers at the community level.

Projects may include community based activities such as the following:

- ' Record, document and preserve First Nations languages.
- ' Conduct assessments of the status of First Nations languages.
- ' Develop materials to increase First Nations languages use and proficiency.
- ' Build capacity through professional development and certification of fluent speakers, teachers and elders.
- ' Develop systems for facilitating communications in First Nations languages.
- ' Organize gatherings of language families to share ideas and develop strategies for language revitalization, retention and maintenance.
- ' Develop mechanisms for sharing information, materials and other resources among First Nations language groups.
